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Supplemental Funding Ensures Promises Are Kept

The Senate kept its promises to teachers, school districts, cities and to the general public when it passed the supplemental funding contained in Senate Bill 1959. The measure ensures that Nationally Board Certified Teachers will indeed receive their bonuses in 2011-12 without those payments being deferred for an additional year. The funding also takes care of school districts which are required to budget for 12 months of insurance costs but were only set to receive ten months worth because of budget cuts by the State Board of Education.

Members who campaigned on supporting public safety can point to following through with their votes in support of ensuring there are more troopers on Oklahoma highways and that the Medical Examiner has made progress towards getting their accreditation back. While much more needs to be done to achieve both of these goals, this supplemental funding is vital for them to get their needs met.

Cities and towns which had been suffering from the lack of Oklahoma providing funding for the many ice storms, tornados, hail storms and wildfires were finally made whole through SB1959. While there is not yet funding in place for future emergencies, the past obligations will be retired through this one funding stream.

Doing Things Differently

The Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services oversees the budgets of eleven state agencies with combined appropriations of nearly \$2 billion, just under one-third of the state budget. These agencies, in one way or another, touch the lives of every citizen in Oklahoma, so it's important to ensure that they are adequately funded.

The Appropriations Subcommittees conducted our agency program performance and budget reviews in January. The Health and Human Services agencies requested over \$580 million in additional funding over what they received last year.

Given that the Governor and legislative leaders have already stated that most agencies will at best see a flat budget, the committee needs to be able to recognize the actual needs of the various agencies, rather than just their wants.

In order to see where the most critical needs are among the Health and Human Services agencies, we decided to conduct our performance reviews on site at some of the facilities. We thought it was best to see for ourselves how these agencies function and what services they provide.

The Governor and the legislature worked together last year to pass bills to help make Oklahoma's state government smaller, smarter and more efficient. Yet another reason we visited these sites - to see if these agencies are operating as efficiently as possible to ensure that taxpayers are getting the greatest bang for their buck. It's our jobs as legislators to ensure that not a penny of taxpayer money is being wasted.

Our first day of tours took place in Norman where we visited the Cleveland County Health Department, the J.D. McCarty Center, the Thunderbird Clubhouse, and the Children's Recovery Center. The next day we went to the Gary Miller Children's Justice Center in El Reno and then traveled back to Oklahoma City to see the Peggy and Charles Stephenson Oklahoma Cancer Center and the Children's Hospital at the OU Medical Center. The next week we traveled south to Sulphur to tour the Oklahoma School for the Deaf, the Sulphur Veterans Center and then went on to the Southern Oklahoma Resource Center in Pauls Valley.

These tours helped us see firsthand some of the needs of our state's health and human services agencies. We were able to talk to the people who live in the different facilities as well as the staff. The committee now feels confident in making budget decisions for these agencies.



So What's Next?

Now that a supplemental funding agreement has been reached and passed, the work towards a FY 2013 budget can begin in earnest. Senate and House budget leaders are meeting weekly to discuss the various requests by the agencies and bills passed by the Subcommittees and the full Appropriations Committees are also being taken into consideration.

Meanwhile, discussions of tax cuts still impact the ability to write a budget. As the three tax relief bills continue to be debated and discussed, ideas towards tax cuts are being weighed seriously in hopes of achieving meaningful tax relief for all Oklahomans.
